Prepare for Success website

- Menu of 23 multimedia learning resources, introducing aspects of academic life, study skills, and teaching and learning styles in the UK
- Study Pathways: a choice of routes through the learning resources by skill or by topic
- > FAQs: browsable bank of simple questions and answers about academic study in the UK
- ➤ FAQs for FE: browsable bank of specific questions and answers for students entering Further Education
- > Teacher/institution webpage with downloadable resources and usage guidance
- ➤ Linked social networking sites: Facebook and Twitter



Prepare for Success

- > Since July 2008 over 400,000 visits
- > Student users from 213 countries
- > 100+ UK receiving institutions use it (HE 80%; FE 20%)
- > c.270 site feedback forms from student users
- ➤ Use by other institutions (UK secondary schools and sixth form colleges, institutions overseas)
- > Traffic through 'referrer' websites linking to PfS

EAP Toolkit

- ➤ In-sessional online tool for academic study skills and language development
- > For international students (c. 5.5 to 7 IELTS /equiv.)
- ➤ 100+ interactive learning resources (80+ hours learning activity)
- > Refreshed for 2011/licensed to other institutions since 2005
- > For VLE use in Moodle, Blackboard etc. or web-hosted access
- > Versatile use



EAP Toolkit contents

- > Academic writing
- > Academic reading and critical thinking
- ➤ Academic listening and note-taking
- > Academic communication skills
- > Grammar for academic purposes
- > Vocabulary for academic purposes




How do institutions use the EAP Toolkit?

How did teachers use the EAP Toolkit?

I encouraged my students to use it for independent learning I referred individual students to it for particular needs I referred my students to items in it for lesson consolidation I used it in my classroom teaching / as part of my lessons I referred my students to items in it for preparations before lessons I used it as a basis for my own lesson preparation I added items into an independent learning programme for my students I directed support tutors to it to back up teaching





Shared design features

- ➤ Separable building blocks for induction course/resource set inclusion
- Activity-based approach 'learning by doing'
- Engage students in reflection
- Enhanced with feedback, help, extra resources
- Make use of different media (audio, video, text, flash)
- > Flexible modes of delivery/ use
- ➤ Consistently designed, styled and sized (bite-sized chunks for learning)
