Title: Engaging and developing staff and students in technologyenhanced learning through a Community of Practice

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Session Learning Outcomes

Session Outline

Key issues to be addressed are:

This poster aims to share the experience of Southampton Solent University (SSU) in developing, running and benefitting from its technology-enhanced learning Community of Practice (TEL CoP).

Our objective in establishing TEL CoP was to bring together staff and students to share and evaluate practice in the use of technology in various aspects of teaching and learning. TEL CoP has engaged lecturers across the University in exposing existing practice and building new practice and research. We have also actively engaged students in the process of recognising TEL practices that most benefit them in their learning and for their employability.

The poster will show how TEL CoP was organised around the development of three initial strands of interest: Digital Literacies; Classroom and mobile technologies; and Online pedagogies. Each of these strands developed with their own unique activities, and distinct outputs. However, we have also witnessed clear cross fertilisation of benefits arising from these.

It is hoped that colleagues from other institutions will benefit from understanding the motivation behind creating such a community, the challenges faced in setting up and running it and the potential impact that such an activity can have on the engagement of staff and students in the effective use of TEL for an improved student experience.
